She co-founded the Disability Rights Education and Defense Fund (DREDF), a leading National Civil Rights Law and Policy Center, in 1979. Ms. Breslin currently serves as Senior Policy Advisor with DREDF, directing the organization's healthcare initiatives. During her career, she served as a Policy Consultant, Researcher, and Trainer and lectured on disability and related civil rights topics. She has conducted research, written, and published on various disability rights topics, including health care and disability. Ms. Breslin served as Editor and Researcher with the Disability Rights and Independent Living Project of the Regional Oral History Office of the Bancroft Library at the University of California, Berkeley for eight years.
